Well done to Sophie, Holly, Amelia, Ruby & Gracie in Year 4 who raised £48.06 with their charity stall. Our new breakfast club started this week and the children have enjoyed a variety of breakfast foods, including porridge, toast, pancakes & cereals and activities including dancing, games & mindful colouring. There are still a few places available and the app will be open for any children who wish to join breakfast club.



Mr. Clark and the school & eco councils launched our Plastic Free Week with a special assembly on Monday. The children talked about all the dangers of plastic to the planet, how much plastic our school uses and what we can do to cut our use of it. Throughout the week the children have taken part in a wide range of activities. Nursery went litter picking in the valley and sorted their rubbish into the correct bins. Years 1, 2 & 5 have taken part in trash mobs, collecting litter both inside & outside of the school grounds. Reception & Year 1 had a workshop with Sue & Dave from Tameside Council about recycling.

The Waste Avenger from Salford University visited Years 3 & 4, Year 6 made reduced waste packed lunches and Year 5 facetimed the founder of Plogolution. Some of the school & eco councilors visited IKEA & McDonalds to see how they are trying to cut down on plastic use. Everyone tried to use as little plastic as possible and if they did, tried to make sure it was reused.

The week ended with an assembly today (Friday) to evaluate how much less plastic we used compared to a normal week in school and the reduction of plastic has been amazing; the number of single use plastic water bottles brought in by children has halved from 220 to 110 across school, single use milk bottles in school have decreased from 720 to 55, single use fruit pots used for school dinners have gone down from 200 to 0 and the amount of single use plastic items in lunchboxes has decreased from 2210 items to 960.



Mrs. McQuillan hopes to have enough evidence to show the organisers of 'Plastic Free Schools', so that Canon Burrows can officially be called a Plastic Free School.

Thanks to everyone for their support with the week; visitors, parents, shops and of course the children. Let's keep up this brilliant start and make it a plastic free future for the planet. Look out for news about the week in the press too.

We have received our 10<sup>th</sup> ECO Schools green flag and a lovely letter from ECO Schools about all our environmental work. Our inspector said, "I was very pleased with the knowledge of the children, not only on local environmental issues but global ones as well, they had a very good understanding of biodiversity and habitats and a scientific approach to research and comparison of data collected over a certain length of time.
