Our book week started with an assembly about our focus book 'Greta and the Giants'. The children enjoyed seeing the


story being acted out. Classes have taken part in activities based on the book throughout the week.

Dear Parent or Guardian,

We are running a 'Read for Good Readathon' in school and we would love your child to join in.

The charity Read for Good encourages children to read, through its unique motivational approach inspiring reluctant readers to read more frequently, and keen readers to read more widely. Children can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audio books to blogs. The Readathon will foster a love or reading and promote the importance of reading for pleasure. Children are motivated to read because the money they raise in sponsorship helps to provide a regular supply of brand new books and a resident storyteller for the Manchester Children's Hospital.

Our sponsored Readathon will take place next week (Monday 9th March – Friday 13th March). Each class will participate in a sponsored reading session each day. By the end of the week, each child will have read for a minimum of 50 minutes and they are encouraged to read even more at home!

All you have to do is:

- 1. **Take a look at what they plan to read**, or help them complete their list of books to read on their sponsor form. Remember they can read whatever they want: books, e-books, poetry, comics anything goes!
- 2. **Help your child find sponsors among family and friends**. Your child will bring home a sponsor card on Monday 9th March to fill in these are for the child's records and do not need to be brought back into school. The way to sponsor a child is at https://readathon.secure.force.com/sponsor simply enter our school name into the search box and sponsor the child with your chosen donation. The sponsorship deadline is Monday 30th March.

Our school receives free books worth 20% of our grand sponsorship total — so there really is something in it for everyone. For more information, visit www.readforgood.org.


