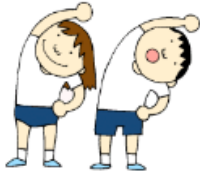

Healthy Body, Healthy Mind Week

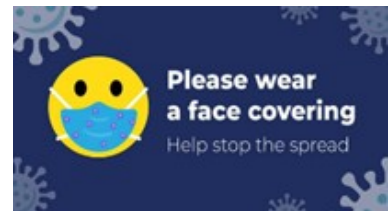

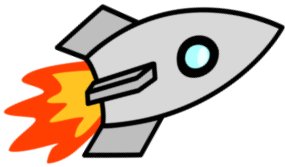

Books are popping up everywhere!

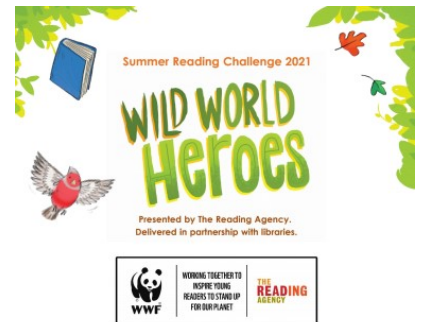
The KS2 children who received their book voucher had a great time choosing a book from our pop-up book stall last Friday afternoon.

From the Office

Please could all parents/carers make sure that they are checking emails regularly and check that notifications are turned on, on their SchoolComms App. We are sending out lots of electronic communication at the moment and we don't want you to miss any important messages.

Alternative pick up arrangements

Please can parents/carers ensure that they let the office know if someone else is collecting their child, where possible by 2pm each day. This ensures that those who are sending children out are aware that they are going with another adult. Please can you also have a password ready, so we can ensure the identity of the person on arrival this will be recorded for future use.

Children's belongings

Please can parents/carers ensure their child(ren) have everything they need at the very start of the school day in order to avoid multiple visits from parents/carers and other family members/friends to the gate. This will reduce the number of objects being passed from person to person and help reduce the risk of spread of infection.

Parents of children currently attending Canon Burrows, who have a younger sibling approaching 3 years of age, can apply for a nursery place. Please contact the office for more information.

If you are in Year 5 or Year 6:

Read five times a week – one of these five times must be with an adult. Each time you read, you must write in your reading diary with either a summary of the key events or your thoughts about what you have read. The adult you read with must write in your diary at least once per week.

Your reading diary needs to be in school every day for your teacher to see please.

We would really encourage you to read the weekends too – the more reading you do, the better!

We are pleased to announce that we have organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise money for our school fund.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for school it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our **Bag2School** collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to <http://uk.bag2school.com/> for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

Please put your items in a black bin-bag and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!
