A reminder of why reading is important...

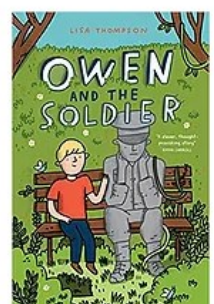
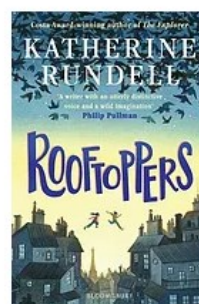
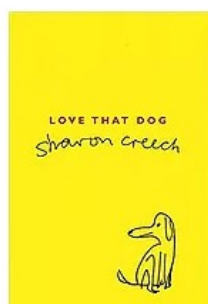
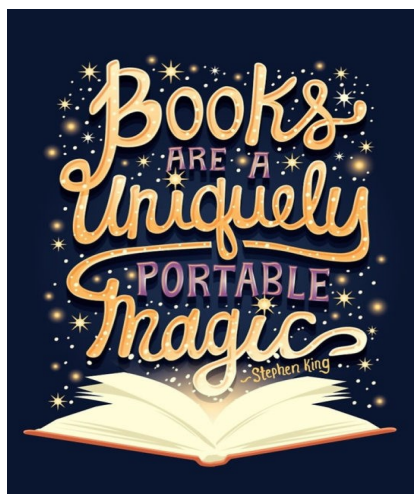
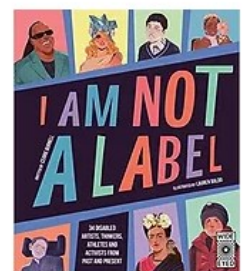
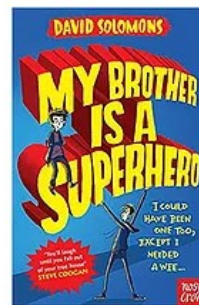
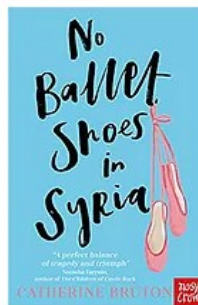
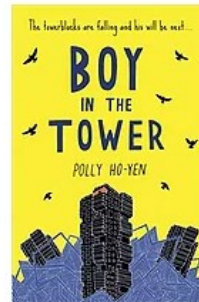
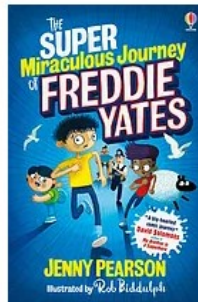
If you read for **1 minute a day**, you will see **8,000 words** a year.

If you read for **5 minutes a day**, you will see **282,000 words** a year.

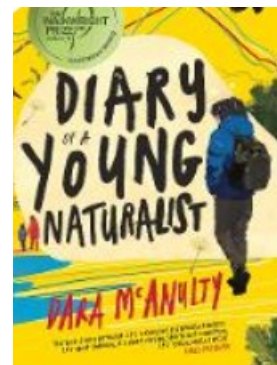
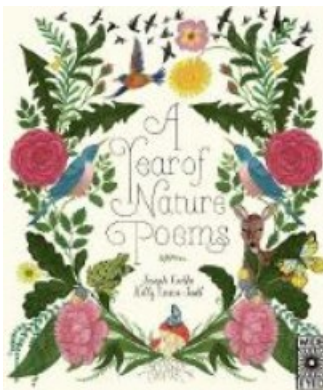
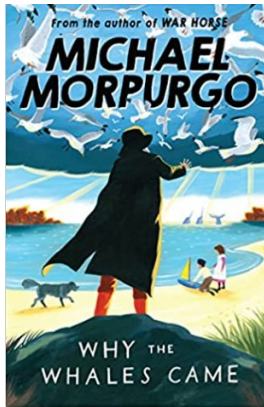
If you read for **20 minutes a day**, you will see **1,800,000 words** a year!
